After the car cruise-in, around 1:30 or so, we will be giving away an Apple Ipad mini, with Foreflight, WIFI & cellular (GPS). Every pilot who registers will receive a complimentary chance to win. Chances will also be available to purchase at the Fly-In. Not limited to pilots, and no limit on amount of chances you may purchase. YOU MUST BE PRESENT TO WIN.

We are also planning on having a band on Saturday, from 4-7pm. Western Range will be providing a variety of family friendly music for your enjoyment. Gary's Cub Pub will be open at 4:30 on Saturday. As always, underwing camping and tent/RV camping is available. If you're tenting underwing, we ask that you keep your tent size to a minimum for obvious reasons. Camping is primitive, no hook-ups. Showers are on site. Camping fees are paid upon arrival, beginning on the day you arrive. Because we lease the land for the week, the earliest you are permitted to arrive is Sunday, after 12 noon.

\*Note\* Bikes, motorcycles, golf carts, ATV's, vehicles, etc. are NOT permitted on the field. Exceptions will be made for those who need assistance getting around...permits are available at the Little Yellow Cubhouse. Be advised you must have proof of insurance with S.J. as a rider on your policy for the week. Sorry for any inconvenience, as we must COA! They are permitted in the camping area, if you ride responsibly! Children under the age of 12 must be accompanied by an adult at all times while on the airfield. Do not allow them to run ahead of you. Watch out for moving propellers. Pets are permitted, provided they are kept on a leash, kept away from other people's planes, & don't disturb the other guests. They are not permitted in the picnic pavilion, and you must clean up after them...for obvious reasons.

Remember to tie down upon your arrival, before you leave your parking spot to go register. It gets windy in this valley! Bring a lawn chair if you plan on being on the flight line, watching the action.

Take time to read the bulletin boards, as they contain lots of info you may need.

The commercial vendor building will be open from 9am-5pm daily.
